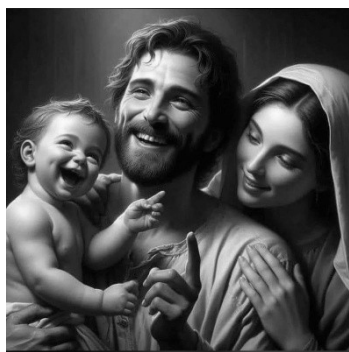

Today we celebrate the Feast of the Holy Family — Jesus, Mary, and Joseph — a model of love, faith, and unity for all Christian families. This feast reminds us that holiness begins at home. The family is the first school of love, forgiveness, and faith. In the Gospel, we see Joseph and Mary's obedience to God's will, even in uncertainty. They trusted God completely, and their home became a dwelling place of divine love.

The Holy Family faced challenges—poverty, exile, danger—but they remained faithful and united. This teaches us that holiness is not about a life without problems, but about responding to life's trials with trust in God and love for one another.

As we reflect today: Do we make time for prayer as a family? Do we practice patience and forgiveness at home? Do we allow God to be at the centre of our relationships?

*Jesus, Mary, and Joseph, bless my family. Help us to live in harmony, to forgive generously, and to keep God at the heart of our home. Amen.*
