At his baptism Jesus is seen as the pilgrim God from heaven who joins in our pilgrim way to heaven. Jesus joins fully his sinful people. Jesus does not expect a perfect people. He is letting us know he is really one of us. He loved – his heart reached out to people in need. His love was always love in action. Our baptism means something like that – we take on a way of life by it. At some stage we want to be partners with Jesus, as he was partner with us. The basics of the church are we are a community of prayer, love and care, committed to the reign of justice. The human in us joins the human in him; the divine in him joins the human in us. The Spirit which descends upon Jesus is not just about Jesus, just as our baptism is not just about our personal relationship with God. We are baptised into a community. We are called to transmit the faith, which affirms the dignity of every human person.

The Spirit which Isaiah proclaimed is a Spirit that will "bring justice to the nations" Catholic Social Teaching reminds us that the Spirit which we receive is not just an interior gift or feeling, but a gift that strives to bring healing between diverse peoples – nations, races, ethnic groups, etc. etc. The Spirit of Baptism is a spirit that transforms the community and calls us to go out to the world. Isaiah makes it clear that the light of this spirit is "for all the nations." The challenge of the scriptures is to make real today the promises of Isaiah and the commitment of Jesus. We are called to a deep commitment to certain values and ways of living.

Parish Notices

Blessing of Homes: Today we bless the water that will be used to bless our homes. Go home and sprinkle it in every room beginning at the back door and finish at the front, pray: May Christ bless (+) our home (+) and remain (+) with us throughout the new year. Amen.

All return to the front door to pray together. *All: Our Father, who art in heaven... ...deliver us from evil. Amen.* All those present are sprinkled with holy water. Lord our God, we ask you to bless our family watch over and protect us through all the days to come. We praise you and thank you, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, now and forever.

First Sacrament Part 2: Holy Communion will be celebrated on Saturday 16 May in Cottingley at 11:00 am for those who received the Sacrament of Reconciliation last year. Children who are on the program should check in with me after Mass each Sunday.

First Sacraments Part 1: applications are now open for those in year 3 or above who wish to enrol to receive the sacrament of Reconciliation for the first time this year and the Eucharist next year. Candidates should be attending Mass here regularly. Forms can be obtained from Fr. Pollard after Mass and should be returned to him by the 1 February. Classes will be held in Cottingley on Saturday mornings 10:30-12:00 and at least one parent should attend with their child.
