"Behold the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world." These words are so familiar—heard at every Mass—that we may forget their depth. John is not offering a poetic title or a gentle compliment; he is proclaiming Jesus as the sacrificial Lamb who will freely take upon Himself the weight of our sin, our wounds, and our human frailty. In that brief sentence, he reveals both the mission of Christ and the hope offered to the world.

What is most remarkable is John's humility. Crowds have gathered around him, some even wondering if he might be the Messiah. Yet the moment Jesus appears, John steps back, pointing away from himself and toward the One who surpasses him. His purpose is not to draw attention but to lead others into a deeper encounter with Christ. John embodies what true discipleship looks like: not self-promotion, but self-gift; not spotlight, but service. The revelation of Jesus as the Lamb of God is also a reminder of God's relentless desire to save, heal, and renew us. No burden is too heavy, no sin too deep, no past too broken for the Lamb who takes it all upon Himself. Our task is simply to behold Him—really behold Him—allowing His mercy to reach the places in us that need it most.

This Gospel invites us to examine our own witness. Do our words and actions direct others toward Christ, or toward ourselves? Like John, we are called not only to recognise the Lamb of God but to help others see Him—through kindness offered quietly, forgiveness given generously, and compassion shown consistently.

Blessing of Candles: On the feast of the Presentation, 2 February, if you wished to have candles blessed for use at home, you are invited to bring to the 10:00am Mass where they will be blessed.
