Journeying companions: Our fellow parishioners, prayer group, family, parish. + 2 ticks. I belong to groups/networks around the country where I journey with them as disciples. + 3 ticks

Marginalised: Black people, LGBT people + 3 ticks. Young people, people with special needs, people with disabilities SEN, + 6 ticks

Women who feel they have a vocation + 2 ticks

Young parents + 2 ticks

Divorced people + 5 ticks

The church needs to reflect society in the 21st century + 6 ticks

More use of social media to get Christ's message out there to all people + 7 ticks

1 . Listening

low might our local Church better listen to lay people (and especially young people and women) and minorities and those who are not respected?

Open conversation- invite discussion and respond + 11ticks

Questionnaires - eg access to church + 9 ticks

Encourage children's liturgy, "Messy" church +10 ticks

Involve with Inn churches + 9 ticks

Poor people + 4 ticks

Organise social events for <u>Families</u> where women/minorities/young people would find it easier to come along + 7 ticks

Teenagers – work with local secondary and Primary school + 7 ticks

Young people are our and the church's future. They expect the church to be part of and to reflect the needs of society in the 21st century + 4 ticks

Youth clubs/groups + 3 ticks

Use modern social media + 2 ticks

Paid organisier for the parish to relieve the priest from "housekeeping" tasks so he can do more of his priestly duties + 3 ticks

III. Speaking out

How can everybody be encouraged to communicate appropriately what is important to them?

Have a way in which ideas can be shared.

Parish council + 9 ticks Facebook, Whatsapp etc

To feel able to approach the PP + 7 ticks

Feel able to talk to and be listened to by the Diocesan hierarchy + 2 ticks

Talk to other parishioners with a view to involve those who can make changes. + 6 ticks

Questionnaires - unmet needs

Contact details available - people with different skills.

House groups + 3 ticks

Prayer groups + 5 groups

Small groups are safer spaces to share what's important to you + 6 ticks

Provide a variety of parish activities where different groups of people feel comfortable and can talk to others + 4 ticks

IV. Celebrating

How might I be better able to participate in Mass and other liturgies?

They deepen our understanding of scripture + 8

Periods of silence during the mass + 4 ticks

Gives us a sense of belonging.+ 2

Makes us feel part of a larger family + 2

Helpful if the priest links scripture readings to everyday life examples we can follow +6 ticks

Being able to ask questions about readings which you might find puzzling + 3 ticks

V. Co-responsible in the mission

How can each Baptised person become a *"missionary disciple", revealing Christ to others through their words and deeds?

Are these 10 questions the ones we really need to be asking? + 1 tick

Being a silent witness + 4 ticks

By our actions - SVP, TWIG, UCM, Children's liturgy

Inn churches being involved + 7 ticks

By example in our words and deeds

Be a witness, an example, sometimes we do have to say out loud that our faith matters + 1 tick Absolutely.

VI. Dialogue in Church and society

How might we improve our conversations within our diocesan family and also outside of it, (for example with people of different faiths, those who have no faith and those who have particular roles and duties in society)?

Deanery meetings which include the laity.

Parish councils feeding in to the diocesan structure + 3 ticks

Opportunities for learning about other faiths

Interfaith events, celebrations, ecumenism, more joint services + 11 ticks, walks, visits invitations and events. + 1

Invite people to our services + 3 ticks eg stations of the cross (once very successful here) + 1 tick National networks, eg Celebrat, Sion

Attend ecumenical meetings /services + 2 ticks

VII. With the other Christian denominations

Are our relations with our Christian brothers and sisters good? How might they be improved?

In this locality YES, but we should be prepared to accept invitations + 6 ticks

We don't host ecumenical services/events at this church – these happen5 ticks5 in other local churches + 5 ticks

We need to join with other Christian denominations + 5 ticks

Join the local council of churches + 3 ticks

Together we need to identify common aims and work together to realise them.

Have the leaders of out parish ever met with leaders of other churches (non-catholic)? + 2 ticks Have WELCOME sign over the entrance of every Catholic church.

We have to be prepared to <u>listen and learn</u> from them, eg female roles int eh parish – Deacons?! + 3 ticks

We are in contact with the local clergy in Bingley – don't know about Cottingley - + 2 ticks We host services when it's our turn – Christian Unity Service and WDP – this year it is our turn at Sacred Heart – (Covid allowing)

VIII. Authority and participation

How might we develop teamwork and a sense of co-responsibility in our local Church?

Get to know people + ask people for their help – not everyone will volunteer (not everyone feels confident) + 8 tickets

Have a functioning parish council + 12 ticks

Create an open atmosphere where various and disparate groups and interests are enabled and encouraged + 5 ticks

SVP + 2 ticks

Collaboration + 3 ticks

Greeters! + 5 ticks

Welcomers! This is so important and we need to take it seriously and devote more resources + 2 ticks

Have a "volunteer" list available for events etc

People take on roles they are able to and comfortable eg pray for people, or more active + 1 tick People living alone to forma a community and pray for all intentions -

IX. Discerning and deciding

How might we improve the process of decision-making in our local Church, so that we truly listen and recognise that the Holy Spirit can speak through each one of us?

Have a functioning Parish council, Elected members. + 10 ticks

Encourage the Hierarchy to rethink the manner in which the church is managed and its rules. + 7

More frequent feedback opportunities? + 5 ticks

A less formal setting than a parish council (House Groups) + 3

Create a sense that the diocesan hierarchy are really interested and open to grass-roots views and views from a variety of folks, ie children. Women, LGBTQ etc + 4 ticks

I'd like to see women deacons who can bring their skills to this - let the priest focus on their role as priest, not administrator (women also have other strengths and I want to hear their voices too!)

X. Forming ourselves in synodality

What formation is necessary within the local Church if we are to become better at listening to one another and sharing our insights with one another?

Once we are able to have meetings again (re Covid) there are resources eg Sycamore, café, which would be good to promote in the parish. + 2 ticks

Don't be afraid to use tools that the people are listening to are comfortable with eg digital surveys for young people, drama and going into he spaces where those people are comfortable. +6 ticks

To become good listeners, we have to listen to God first. + 1

Prayer broups + 2 ticks

Is it time to think about women Priests and Deacons to facilitate a better understanding of all

Need to reflect the aspirations of youing people in the 21st century. + 3 ticks Paid youth workers - trained in the diocese + 2 ticks
